Why wood stoves can be carbon-neutral - for some of us

Sir: Burning wood releases back the atmosphere $\mathrm{C}^{2}$ that was $\qquad$ 73 $\qquad$ from it only _ 74 $\qquad$ . Therefore it is theoretically possible to have a carbon-neutral situation if for every log burned another is grown somewhere in the $\qquad$ 75 $\qquad$ though preferably as near to the stove as possible. $\qquad$ 76 $\qquad$ it has recently been shown that in the case of biofuel grown as a replacement for petrol, there is not sufficient suitable land in the world for _ 77 production of enough biofuels to service vehicles and other usage at its _ 78 ___ le level. This leaves no land for further cultivation of wood - and I suspect that there would still not be enough land to $\qquad$ 79 wood so that most of us could use it, even if it were not in competition for space with other $\qquad$ 80 $\qquad$ .
